# The Invisible Face

### INTRODUCTION

**W**e all know that quiet emptiness that shows up out of nowhere. Life keeps moving... yet something inside feels stuck. Success doesn't fill it. Shopping doesn't fix it. Distractions don't silence it. It's an empty space no one admits publicly, but everyone recognizes privately.

Some call it "spiritual hunger." Others try to ignore it and bury it under work, noise, or relationships. But in the end, we're all searching for the same thing: a Someone who can explain why we're here... a Someone who doesn't disappoint... a Someone who answers when the heart finally opens.


And even though no one can draw His face, that universal longing points in one direction: there is a God who isn't hiding He's simply waiting to be sought with honesty.

In this lesson, we will discover who God is and how He has made Himself known: through creation, through Scripture, and most fully through the person of Jesus. Humanity's greatest privilege is not only believing that God exists, but knowing Him personally and being transformed by His character of love, justice, and mercy.

# LET'S EXPLORE THE BIBLE

## A. God exists and makes Himself known

- **The Bible begins by stating:** “In the beginning God created...” Genesis 1:1 (NKJV).
- **It does not argue His existence:** it presents it as an absolute reality.
- **Creation itself is evidence:** “The heavens declare the glory of God” Psalm 19:1 (NKJV).



## B. God reveals Himself in three main ways

- **In nature:** The perfection of the universe speaks of a Creator Romans 1:20 (NKJV).
- **In the Bible:** It is His letter of love and truth to humanity 2 Timothy 3:16 (NKJV).
- **In Jesus Christ:** The supreme revelation: “Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father” John 14:9 (NKJV).



## C. The character of God

- Love 1 John 4:8 (NKJV).
- Justice Psalm 89:14 (NKJV).
- Mercy Exodus 34:6-7 (NKJV).
- Holiness Isaiah 6:3 (NKJV).

The Bible shows that God is not an impersonal power but a Being who thinks, loves, feels, and acts in favor of His children.



## D. Our calling

God not only wants us to know that He exists but to know Him personally Jeremiah 9:23-24 (NKJV).

## PERSONAL DECISION

What we've seen today should lead us to a personal decision: Today I choose to seek a deeper knowledge of God, not just intellectual, but relational. This means spending time reading His Word, talking to Him in prayer, and recognizing His presence in the simple things of daily life.

## PRACTICAL TIPS FOR THIS LESSON

### **Why do some deny God and believe in evolution?**

Many think life arose by chance, out of nothing. Yet science itself shows that every effect has a cause, and complexity requires design. In fact, it takes more faith to believe the universe came from nothing without purpose than to believe in an intelligent and loving Creator. As Psalm 19:1 (NKJV) declares: "The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows His handiwork."

### **Is nature God?**

No. Nature is God's wonderful work, but it is not divine. Confusing the Creator with His creation leads to idolatry. Romans 1:25 (NKJV) says that some "who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen..." We are not gods either; we are creatures made in His image, dependent on Him for our very existence.



## DID YOU KNOW...?

### How can God be one and yet three?

The Bible teaches there is one God, Deuteronomy 6:4 (NKJV), yet within the Godhead there are three eternal Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit Matthew 28:19 (NKJV). Not three gods, but one God in perfect unity. True love is not found in isolation. From eternity, God has been a community of love, and that love overflows to us.

## IMPORTANT TIP


When you look at the starry sky, a perfect flower, or the birth of a child, remember: these are not works of chance, but marks of the Creator who loves you and wants you to know Him.

## FINAL TIP

A little boy was drawing in his notebook when his mother asked him: “What are you doing?” “I’m drawing God,” he answered confidently. The mother smiled and said: “But no one knows what God looks like.” Without looking up, the boy replied: “Well, when I’m done, they will.”

That child’s innocent response reflects a desire we all share: to know God. Throughout history, millions have tried to define Him: philosophers have reduced Him to an idea, some have seen Him as an impersonal force, and others have considered Him distant, a being who created the world and then left it to its fate. However, the God of the Bible is not an abstract concept or an unreachable mystery. He is a personal, near, and real God who has chosen to reveal Himself to humanity.

Scripture doesn’t try to prove His existence as if it were a lab experiment; it simply declares with certainty: “In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth” Genesis 1:1 (NKJV). From the start, the Bible shows us that He is the origin, the reason, and the purpose of everything. Even more, He is not a distant being but a Father who longs for a relationship with us.

## CONCLUSION

Maybe that emptiness you feel isn’t your enemy. Maybe it’s an invitation. A quiet reminder that you were created for more than survival.

God doesn’t reveal Himself out of pressure or ritual. He reveals Himself when a tired heart finally says, “If You’re there... speak to me.” And He does. In His timing. In His way. But He answers. Because the invisible face everyone searches for... is the only one who has never taken His eyes off you.
